all of it's beauty.

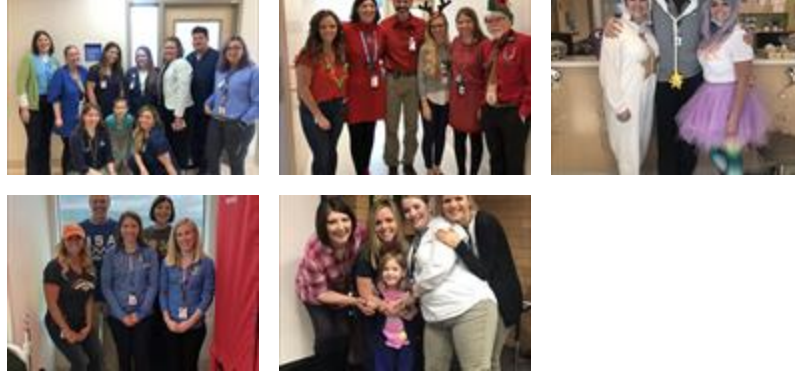

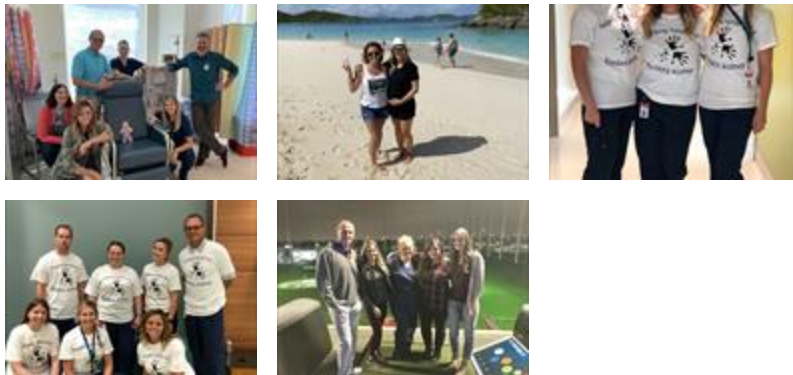

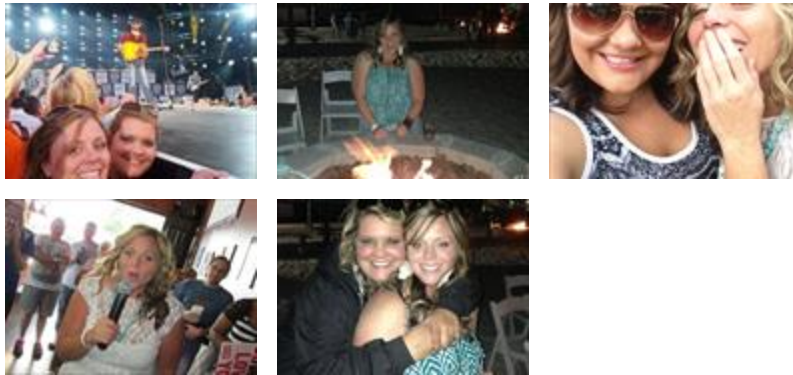
