Olson, in Salt Lake City, Utah. He attended the University of Utah and Westminster college, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Business. Scott became a highly skilled Auctioneer with his unique talent. He then fulfilled his dream of opening his own business Treasures Unlimited. Scott was an active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, serving in various capacities. He married his best friend Leslie Leavitt on May 26th, 1994, the two had been friends since kindergarten. Scott was a lover of life; he could light up a room with his positive energy and sense of humor. He especially loved the outdoors, spending his childhood at Bowery Haven at fish lake, creating precious memories. Scott enjoyed the thrill of snowmobiling in the winter, but summer was his season.
